## Assemble cleaning supplies:

- Bucket & spray bottle
- Paper towels
- Designated or disposable mop head(s)
- Plastic garbage bag & twist-ties
- Disposable scoop, small shovel, or dustpan
- Sand, cat litter, or absorbent powder

## Use special disinfectants\*

Find EPA-registered disinfectants on the EPA website www.epa.gov.

Use chlorine bleach (8.25% concentration) at 5000 parts per million by mixing 1 cup bleach in 1 gallon of water.

\* Do not use standard foodservice sanitizers.
