# Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023

**29 million children**

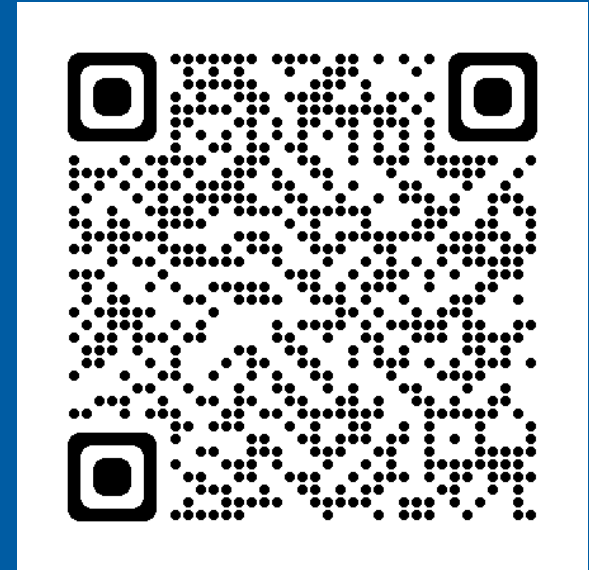




## Interim Final Rule coming by year-end

# Guiding Principles for Summer EBT

- Effectively deliver benefits to eligible families
- Streamline program administration
- Minimize burden on schools
- Provide states temporary flexibilities where needed/possible, as they work to stand up Summer EBT







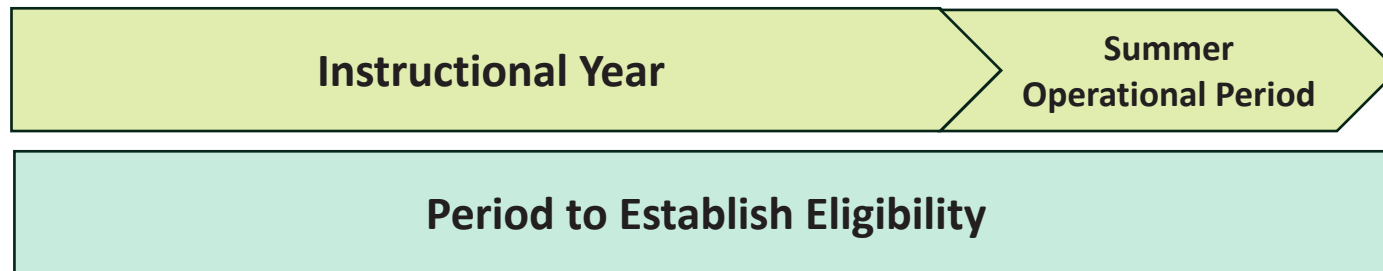
# Eligibility and Enrollment



## Period for Establishing Summer EBT Eligibility

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- Households may establish eligibility for Summer EBT **at any point** between the start of the immediately preceding instructional year through the last day of the summer operational period



- Children certified as eligible for Summer EBT during the summer will be issued the **full summer benefit regardless of the date of certification**

\* If the data for these programs is available at the state level, they must also be used to streamline certify children for SEBT.

# What is School Age for Summer EBT?

## Children enrolled in NSLP/SBP Schools

Children of any age who are enrolled in NSLP/SBP-participating schools if they are also eligible for free or reduced price school meals.

- Children of high school grade or under, including preschool-age children
- Students who are mentally or physically disabled, as defined by the State, and who are participating in a school program established for the mentally or physically disabled

## Children not enrolled in NSLP/SBP schools

School-age means the years in which a child is required to attend school, or an equivalent program as defined by State or Tribal law.

Also known as the age requirement for compulsory education.

# Statewide Database

By 2025, Summer EBT agencies will be required to establish and maintain a State- or ITO-wide database of children who are enrolled in NSLP- or SBP-participating schools

- ✓ Mailing Address
- ✓ Individual Free or Reduced Priced Eligibility



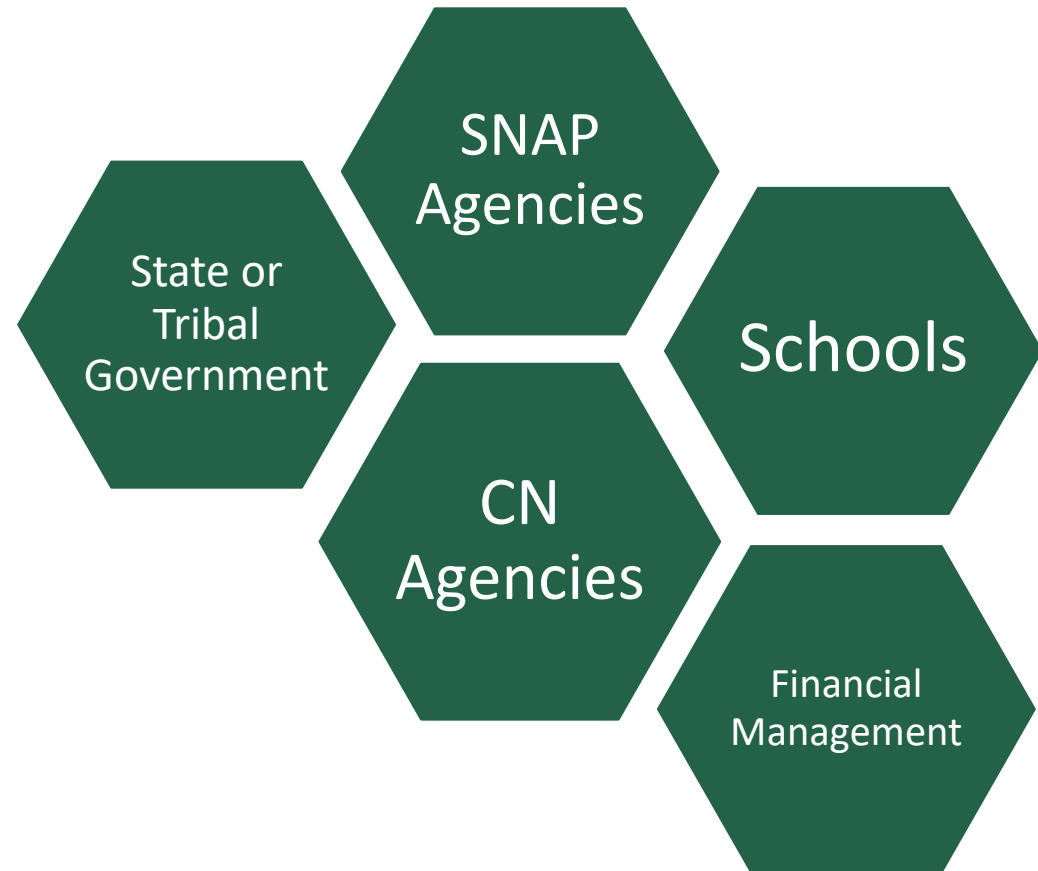

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# Summer EBT in Michigan- Why

- Estimating 900K eligible students
- Goal #3- Improve the health, safety, and wellness of all learners
- Compliments the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) and Rural Non-Congregate SFSP







# Summer EBT in Michigan- Partnerships

- Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) is the lead agency for Summer EBT
  - MDE is the partner agency
    - Student level data is provided by the Center for Educational Performance and Information (CEPI)
- These strong relationships are critical for the success of the program
- MDE is hosting a day-long meeting to bring all partners together

# Center for Educational Performance and Information

- CEPI was established by the Michigan Legislature ([Sect. 94a of the State School Aid Act](#)) to **coordinate** the *collection, management and reporting* of **education data**, from early childhood through K-12 and postsecondary education, and into the workforce.
- CEPI's mission is to:
  - Reduce Data Collection Burdens
  - Transform Education Data
  - Increase Efficiency





# Michigan Student Data System

- CEPI Application used to collect student data
- Leverage existing student data collection processes for Summer EBT rather than incorporate a separate manual process.
- Existing data collections
  - General Collections (Fall, Spring, and End of Year)
    - K-12 and special populations
  - Early Childhood Collections (Fall, Spring, and End of Program)
    - PreK programs (i.e. Head Start, Great Start Readiness Program)
  - Nonpublic School Student Roster Collection (School Year)







# Relevant Data Collected at Student Level

- Personal Demographics
  - Name, UIC, DOB, Gender
- Contact Information
  - Address: Physical, Mailing
- Supplemental Nutrition Eligibility Component
  - Eligible Free
  - Eligible Reduced
  - Direct Certification Extended Eligibility
- Homeless Demographic Component
- Early Childhood Program

# Directly Certified Students

- Students in MSDS are eligible to match with MDHHS data for direct certification
  - SNAP
  - TANF
  - Medicaid Free
  - Medicaid Reduced
  - Foster
- MDHHS data pull and matches occur approximately every 2 weeks
- Districts can pull their Direct Certification Student Status Report from MSDS

- T = Student is certified via Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF). Benefits can be extended to other children in the same household.
- F = Student is a foster child. Benefits cannot be extended to other children in the same household.
- M = Student is certified via Medicaid - Free Meals. Benefits can be extended to other children in the same household.
- R = Student is certified via Medicaid - Reduced Price Meals. Benefits can be extended to other children in the same household.

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# Data Quality

- CEPI Data Quality Team

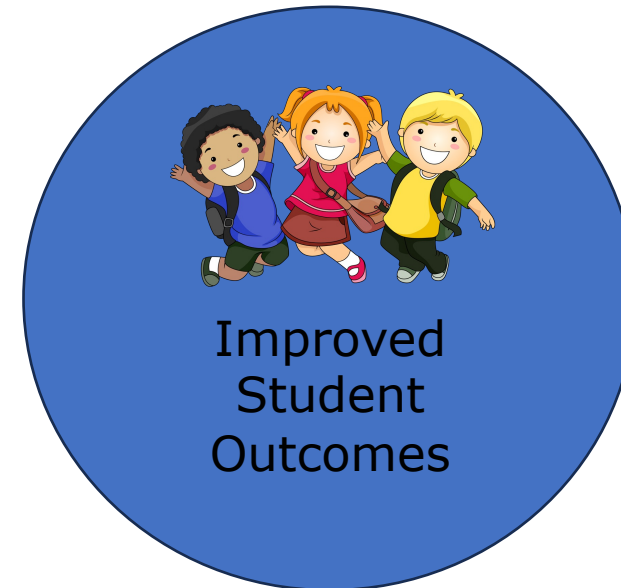
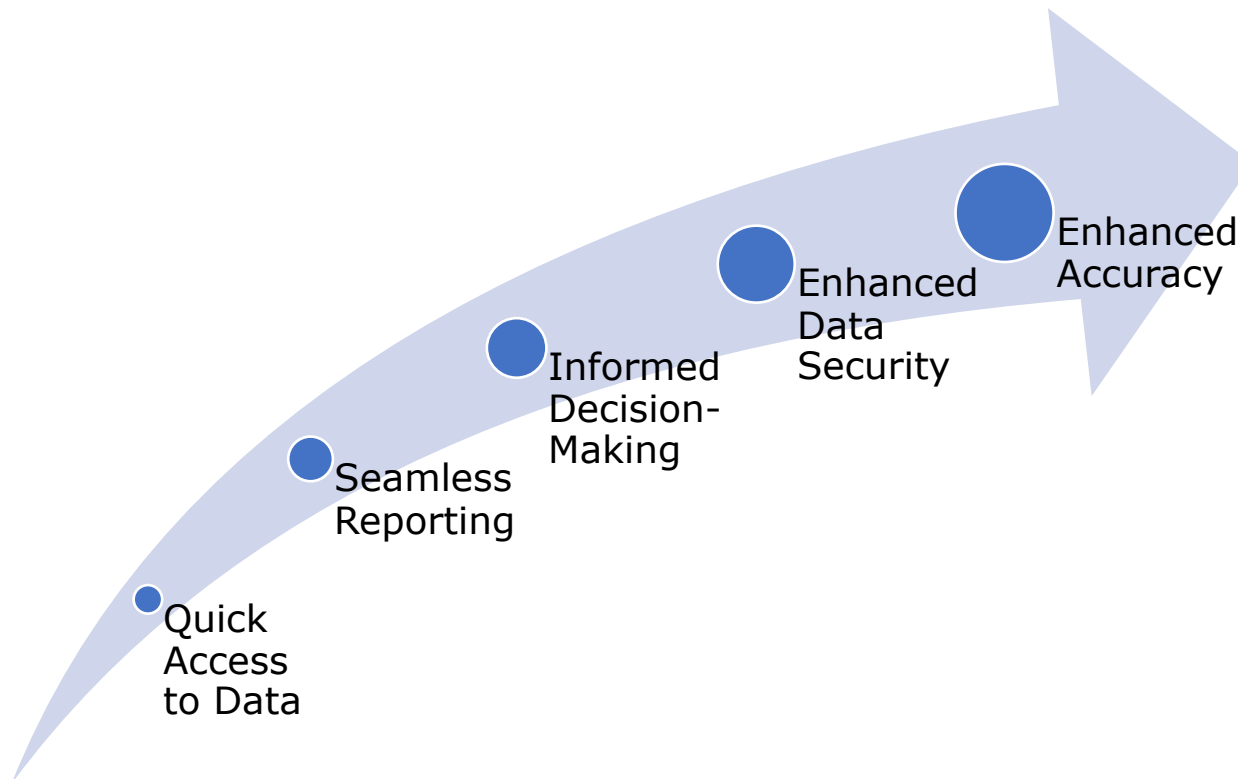
- Policies, Processes and Practices that control our data and ensure quality
- Data quality emails are generated 2-3 times a collection
  - Identify anomalies, compare data volumes to previous collections, provide summaries
  - More than 10 DQs are DC/SNE/Economically Disadvantaged related
    - Sent DQs
      - DQ1027- Supplemental Nutrition Eligibility Counts for CEP Buildings: Significant Decreases
      - DQ1028- Supplemental Nutrition Eligibility Counts for CEP Buildings: High Count
      - DQ1029 -Supplemental Nutrition Eligibility (SNE) Student Count Comparisons: Significant Decreases
      - DQ1030 -Supplemental Nutrition Eligibility (SNE) Student Count: Rate is Less than 10 Percent.
      - DQ1901 -Supplemental Nutrition Eligibility (SNE) Student Count Comparisons: Significant Increases
      - DQ2011 -Economically Disadvantaged Summary – includes all economically disadvantaged categories with deduplicated aggregates and includes a 2-year comparison (Direct Cert, SNE free, SNE reduced, SNE extended, migrant, homeless)
    - Internal DQs
      - DQ1902 - Supplemental Nutrition Eligibility (SNE): Ratio of Reduced-Price Lunch Counts to Free Lunch Counts
      - DQ1903 - Supplemental Nutrition Eligibility (SNE) Comparison with Direct Certification
      - DQ1907 -Large decreases in SNE not picked up DQ1029 (threshold 10 percent)
      - DQ2205 -SNE Extended Eligibility District Summary
      - DQ2012 -District decrease in poverty
      - DQ2013 -District increase in poverty

# Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)

- CEPI General Collections are used for CEP notifications and eligibility postings and posted by MDE
  - Fall collection for district level eligibility posting
  - Spring collection for site level eligibility posting
- CEPI spring data is available in the Coordinated Application, making it simple to apply/reapply for CEP
- Nonpublic schools do not report in the general collection, but use Nonpublic School Student Roster Collection

# Student Data Collection Challenges

Data is self reported by parents/guardians

- Reliability
- Incomplete or inconsistent information
- Language and cultural barriers
- Engagement and response rates

Data is self reported by schools

- Technology
- Staffing
- Validation and verification
- Privacy

SOM reporting requirements

- Legislatively required three times per year
