

Objective

The purpose of this study was to identify researchbased practices for emergency preparedness (EP) in school nutrition (SN) programs.

Method

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The methodology of this project consisted of two phases:

- Phase I involved an eight member expert panel of
 SN directors (n=4), state agency personnel (n=2), school emergency management personnel (n-=1), and emergency management agency personnel (n=1) participating in a two-day workgroup to assist in the development of EP practice statements and goals for an EP resource.
- ♦ A guide for EP was drafted and consisted of four practice categories with 17 goals and 86 practice statements.

In Phase II, the draft guide was evaluated by a national review panel of SN and emergency management professionals (n=31) from six USDA regions. The review panel evaluated the practice statements, goal statements and draft resource for content clarity, accuracy, and usefulness.
